The 2014 Season

With wonderful crowds, fixtures and weather the 2014 season has been a real joy.

For once the weather was on our side and such rain as we had during the summer managed to avoid most match days and we lost just two complete fixtures against Oxford University and Northern Suburbs (Aus), though the ECB under 17 match was also badly affected by rain.

Our winter memories will be full of glorious days of sunshine with entertaining cricket. Is it just me or do we all feel a sense of peace and calmness when we arrive at the ground for a day's cricket?

The highlights of the year must be the excellent crowds and atmosphere for the Christopher Martin-Jenkins memorial match hosted by the Cricket Society, the Hong Kong match, the visit by the England Association of Deaf, I Zingari (which the Duke's X1 won!), Lady Mary's X1 and the England Visually Impaired team. These matches all included the wonderful characteristics of sportsmanship, spirit of cricket, high skill and a love for the game as a whole.



At the Sussex Festival the crowd numbers (over 14000 during the week) powerfully expressed the love within Sussex for their first class cricket at Arundel.

We will continue to work closely, and foster our relationships, with Sussex CCC and the Sussex Martlets to maintain the tradition of Sussex cricket at Arundel.

Improving the Ground



'This Autumn we have undertaken comprehensive works to the cricket square. Immediately after the season had finished the square was 'fraize mowed'. This process is similar to a conventional planning action and so leaves a firm base to play on next year after it has been seeded with dwarf rye grass cultivars and top dressed with Ongar loam.

On 6th October work started on relaying one of the pitches. This involved removing 20cms of the existing soil and replacing it with 26 tons of Ongar loam. We were greatly relieved when we finished 5 days later as, by then, the good weather had broken and the ground conditions around the 'new' pitch were deteriorating. The pitch is seeded and covered in horticultural fleece to aid germination.





If the weather is kind and the grass grows strongly we would look at playing a low key club game there, possibly in 2016.

Peter co-ordinated the BBC's cricket coverage from every one of the Testplaying nations, and has also frequently been part of the commentary team himself. Baxter commentated on the end of the 1992 World Cup Final between England and Pakistan in Melbourne

It is now 28 years since the Foundation was formed to give an important charitable purpose to the club which Lavinia, Duchess of Norfolk had so imaginatively established in 1975.

Since then, thousands of young people have benefited from our lovely ground and cricket school which have provided the backdrop for our work with the young.

Initially, we were motivated by the lack of sporting activity in schools; then we turned to the deprivation experienced in the inner city boroughs and, more recently in the last ten years, to the needs of those disadvantaged by special needs requirements and disabilities.

Arundel has become a haven in the Sussex countryside for groups of young people for whom life is a real struggle. The combination of activities on our ground with visits to attractions such as the castle and seaside have been a winning formula and one which has attracted support from many generous and like-minded institutions.
