Alison Hulme

Alison Hulme is a practising textile artist whose current focus is on print and the written word the fascination for which stems from her dyslexia. Expressing herself by including text in her artwork has given her mastery over writing and text which she didn't have before.

Her current work also reflects her love of form and function – hence she makes pinnies! These inherently domestic and practical items of predominantly female protective-wear are enhanced and beautified to celebrate the role of the wearer as maker, provider and carer.

Each pinny is unique. A length of material is individually printed for each one using multi-layered combination of perhaps dyeing, screen printing, gelatine plate printing, eco-dyeing or printing and machine embroidery.

Alison has worked in France with Crafty Retreats and Jersey at The Harbour Gallery as well as all over mainland UK. She is regularly to be found at the Knitting & Stitching Shows and at the Festival of Quilts where she may be seen working with Art Van Go.



Alison is also a member of the exhibiting group '**Room 6**'. Recent work, depicting the difficulties experienced in her past life, was shown at the Knitting & Stitching Show in 2018.
