Having worked through most of the traditional techniques she is drawn to experiment, layering up techniques wherever she can.

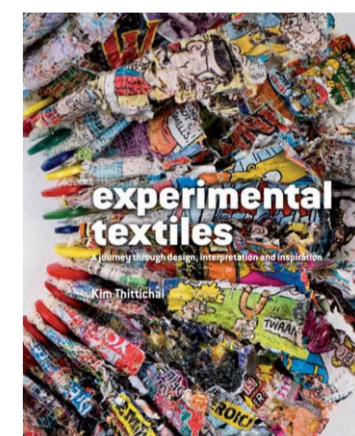
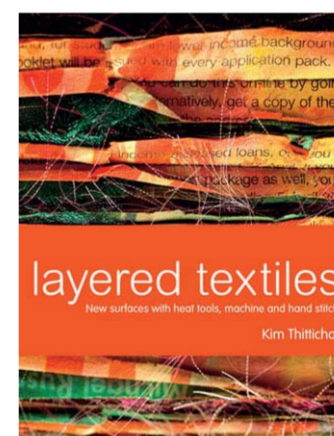
